

**DR. GEORGE W. WALTERS, JR.**  
**Personal Profile**

Dr. Walters is senior pastor and co-founder of Faith Outreach Center Church, president and co-founder of Faith Outreach Academy and president and co-founder of Faith Theological Seminary and Christian College, all located in Tampa, Florida. For the past 30 years, he and his wife, Dr. Mickey L. Walters, have worked faithfully and diligently to spread the Gospel.

In 1962, Dr. Walters accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. The Lord later showed him a vision of “a large assembly area with healings, miracles and power where Jesus was being lifted up.” His ministry would take the Gospel to the immediate community, city, county and the world through evangelism, missionary outreach and other support ministries.

In 1973, Dr. Walters received his license to preach and began his ministry at Oldsmar Baptist Church in Oldsmar, Florida, where he served as youth director (1973-1979) and minister of music (1978-1983). During this time, he also conducted a street ministry on Skid Row, a nursing home ministry at The Graham Home, an outreach ministry to men recovering from alcohol/drug abuse at Lighthouse Gospel Mission, and a jail ministry at the Hillsborough County Stockade, all located in Tampa. From 1980 to 1983, he served as a chaplain at Memorial Hospital, also located in Tampa.

Dr. Walters received certificates of completion from Moody Bible Institute in Old Testament Survey (1977) and New Testament Survey (1981). In 1983, he received a certificate of completion from Word of Faith in Practical Theology. He continued his studies at International Seminary in Plymouth, Florida, and received a Bachelor of Bible Theology (1986), Master of Bible Theology (1987), Doctor of Theology (1988) and Doctor of Philosophy in Theology (1991). He also received a Doctor of Divinity (1990) from Faith Theological Seminary in Tampa, a Doctor of Ministry from Whitefield Theological Seminary in Lakeland, Florida and certification as a Licensed Pastoral Counselor in Family and Marriage (1992) from the National Christian Counselors Association in Sarasota, Florida.

In 1983, Dr. Walters and his wife founded Faith Outreach Center Church, a non-denominational, family-oriented church with an emphasis on training and equipping people for the ministry. In 1984, they established Faith Outreach Academy, an extension of the Christian home in training young people in a Christian environment. In 1985, they founded Faith Theological Seminary and Christian College which currently has campuses throughout the world.

Dr. Walters and his wife have been married for 34 years. They have five children, ten grand- children and two great-grandchildren.
